Disrupting the moral self-regulatory processes that facilitate terrorism: A method of terrorism deterrence

Description: A framework is presented—specifying routine psychological mechanisms of behavior self-regulation that function in support of individual engagement in acts of terrorism. Specifically, moral disengagement and unethical efficacy beliefs are presented as the principal, facilitative moral self-regulatory processes. A sample of Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (ISIL) messaging collected from 100 ISIL websites is presented as initial support for the validity of the proposed framework. Building on this framework, propositions for disrupting inhumane behavior by targeting the mechanisms that foster moral disengagement and unethical efficacy are presented.
