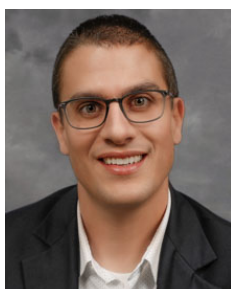

REMOTE TEACHING & LEARNING AT UNK DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

When the COVID-19 virus shut down campuses across the nation, classroom instructors at UNK rose to the challenge of continuing to teach and support students. With little notice, they scrambled to reimagine their classes, creatively using readily available tools to create emergency remote learning. Courses designed for classrooms will not easily adapt to remote learning because the group interaction element is lost. While many are skilled at reimaging interactive learning for an online format, traditional classroom instructors are likely not have the experience or the knowledge of appropriate techniques to teach the curriculum remotely at the level they expect. The converted classrooms are nothing short of a superb display of commitment to continue serving students during the ongoing pandemic.
